Announcements

- The blessing of religious items takes place on the last Sunday of the month. Please place items on the table in the back of the church before Mass.

The special devotion which sets forth the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph as the model of virtue for all Christian households began in the 17th century. It commenced almost simultaneously in Canada and France: the Association of the Holy Family being founded in Montreal in 1663, and the Daughters of the Holy Family in Paris in 1674. Numerous other congregations and associations under the patronage of the Holy Family have been established since that time, and they are spread over the world. The archconfraternity was established by Pius IX in 1847. In 1893 Leo XIII approved a feast for Canada, and Benedict XV extended the Feast of the Holy Family to the whole Church and ordered its celebration to take place on the Sunday after the Epiphany.

To receive Holy Communion:

To receive Holy Communion, you must be a baptized Catholic in a state of grace, having made a good confession since your last mortal sin. You must believe in Transubstantiation and observe a one-hour Eucharistic fast, with recommended abstinence from food and alcohol for three hours prior. Public sinners or those excommunicated are not permitted to receive Communion. A sincere desire to receive Christ's Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity is essential. You may approach the Communion rail after the priest's Communion, extending your tongue smoothly and horizontally. There's no obligation to receive daily, but strive to be in a state to do so (St. Augustin).

Guest and Visitor Information

Out of respect for Our Lord Jesus Christ and for the edification of our neighbor, we beg all to appear in Church decent in deportment and modest in dress. However, no one has the right to question others, especially visitors. It belongs to the parish priest alone to instruct the laity when they repeatedly dress or deport below expectation. **For gentlemen and lads:** Neither shorts, T-shirts nor sneakers meet the norms of modesty. **For ladies and girls:** Neither shorts, slacks, sleeveless, short nor low-cut dresses meet the norms of modesty. Furthermore, according to apostolic custom or Church law, gentlemen are bareheaded in church; and ladies are requested to cover their heads. Thank you for your charity.
