TIMOTHY was a convert of St. Paul. He was born at Lystra in Asia Minor. His mother was a Jewess, but his father was a pagan; and though Timothy had read the Scriptures from his childhood, he had not been circumcised as a Jew. On the arrival of St. Paul at Lystra the youthful Timothy, with his mother and grandmother, eagerly embraced the Faith. Seven years later, when the apostle again visited the country, the boy had grown into manhood, while his good heart, his austerities and zeal had won the esteem of all around him, and holy men were prophesying great things of the fervent youth. St. Paul at once saw his fitness for the work of an evangelist. Timothy was forthwith ordained, and from that time became the constant and much-beloved fellow-worker of the apostle. In company with St. Paul he visited the cities of Asia Minor and Greece—at one time hastening on in front as a trusted messenger, at another lingering behind to confirm in the Faith some recently founded church.

Finally, he was made the first Bishop of Ephesus; and here he received the two epistles which bear his name, the first written from Macedonia and the second from Rome, in which St. Paul from his prison gives vent to his longing desire to see his "dearly beloved son," if possible, once more before his death. St. Timothy himself, not many years after the death of St. Paul, won his martyr's crown at Ephesus. As a child Timothy delighted in reading the sacred books, and to his last hour he would remember the parting words of his spiritual father, "Apply thyself to reading."

To receive Holy Communion:

To receive Holy Communion, you must be a baptized Catholic in a state of grace, having made a good confession since your last mortal sin. You must believe in Transubstantiation and observe a one-hour Eucharistic fast, with recommended abstinence from food and alcohol for three hours prior. Public sinners or those excommunicated are not permitted to receive Communion. A sincere desire to receive Christ's Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity is essential. You may approach the Communion rail after the priest's Communion, extending your tongue smoothly and horizontally. There's no obligation to receive daily, but strive to be in a state to do so (St. Augustin).

Guest and Visitor Information

Out of respect for Our Lord Jesus Christ and for the edification of our neighbor, we begall to appear in Church decent in deportment and modest in dress. However, no one has the right to question others, especially visitors. It belongs to the parish priest alone to instruct the laity when they repeatedly dress or deport below expectation. For gentlemen and lads: Neither shorts, T-shirts nor sneakers meet the norms of modesty. For ladies and girls: Neither shorts, slacks, sleeveless, short nor low-cut dresses meet the norms of modesty. Furthermore, according to apostolic custom or Church law, gentlemen are bareheaded in church; and ladies are requested to cover their heads. Thank you for your charity.
