MONTHLY DEVOTION: THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

ANT. Who is she that cometh forth as the morning rising, fair as the moon, bright as the sun?

V. As the rainbow giving light in the bright clouds.

R. And as the flower of the roses in the days of spring. *Let us pray.* O God, Who through the fruitful virginity of Blessed Mary, didst bestow on mankind the rewards of eternal salvation, grant, we

beseech Thee, that we may experience her intercession for us through whom we were made worthy to receive the Author of life, Jesus Christ Thy Son our Lord, Who liveth and reigneth forever and ever. Amen.



To receive Holy Communion:

- You must be a baptized Catholic, having made a good confession since the last committed mortal sin, if any, in order to hopefully be in the state of Grace.
- You must believe in the doctrine of Transubstantiation. "For anyone who eats and drinks without discerning the body eats and drinks judgment upon himself" (1 Cor. 11:29).
- You must observe one hour of Eucharistic fast (except water and medicine. However, we advise to abstain from food and alcohol for three hours and one hour for other liquid before Holy Communion).
- One must not be a public sinner (public adulterer, concubine, public homosexual), or excommunicated, or interdicted.

The most important requirement is to have a great desire to receive the Body, the Blood, the Soul and the Divinity of our Lord Jesus Christ.

- You can humbly approach the Communion rail at any time after the Communion of the priest.
- Then, open your mouth wide and extend smoothly and horizontally your tongue.
- There is no special order, so that nobody should feel compelled to follow a general movement.
- Do not judge your neighbor who abstains from receiving Holy Communion, as there is no obligation to receive it daily. However, "Live in a manner to be able to receive communion every day!" (St. Augustine).

In this Church, the faculty to absolve sins is directly granted to the priests by the Holy Father.

"I urge you therefore, brothers, by the mercies of God, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God, your spiritual worship." Rm 12:1

DRESS CODE

Out of respect for Our Lord Jesus Christ and for the edification of our neighbor, we beg all to appear in Church decent in deportment and modest in dress.

However, no one has the right to question others, especially visitors. It belongs to the parish priest alone to instruct the laity when they repeatedly dress or deport below expectation.

Gentlemen and lads: Neither shorts, T-shirts nor sneakers meet the norms of modesty.

Ladies and girls: Neither shorts, slacks, sleeveless, short nor low-cut dresses meet the norms of modesty.

Furthermore, according to apostolic custom or Church law, gentlemen are bareheaded in church; and ladies are requested to cover their heads. Thank you for your charity.

THOUGHTS ON OUR DIVINE FRIEND: FOLLOW ME

The Master saw him there at the money table. He was a customs gatherer, this Matthew, a Publican, one despised by the people. But Jesus saw in him a future Apostle. He stood before him. His eyes searched his very soul. His speech was brief – only two words were spoken. He made no promises, He offered no inducements. He simply said "Follow Me." It was sufficient. In an instant Matthew had left his money table, had forgotten his greed for gold, and was ready to follow Jesus wherever He might lead.

"Follow Me!" Over and over again as I walk the journey of life the same gentle Master, My Divine Friend, whispers into my ear the same kindly invitation: "Follow Me."

"Follow Me!" I see His blessed form before me. He points to higher paths than I have had the courage to tread, to paths that climb steeply at times and lead away quite abruptly from the ordinary ways of mediocre goodness, to paths on which, at times, I see bright crimson stains, paths that lead painfully on toward a hill, skull-shaped, outside the walls, crowned with a gibbet that stands out sharply against the horizon, bearing a blood-dripping Victim.

"Follow Me," the pleading voice keeps calling, calling. Can I longer refuse to follow where my Divine Friend leads?

"Follow Me!" Sweet and clear it comes through the din of the tempest.

"Follow Me!" I will be your salvation. "Follow Me!" I will make you a saint. What response shall I make to my Friend's invitation?

Dear Jesus, Divine Friend, have mercy on us.
