St. Thomas More Church, Sanford, FL to Mission Nombre de Dios and the Shrine of Our Lady of La Leche in St. Augustine | Walk 78 miles and canoe 24 miles / or full walk option of 110 miles. | Begins Tuesday, April 22nd, with 7:30 a.m. Mass. Ends Sunday, April 27th, with noon Mass followed by lunch.

PILGRIMAGE OPTIONS

Full Pilgrimage Walk and Canoe – Includes meals, water, snacks, canoes, transportation of belongings to campsites, camping fees, transportation to evening campsites during Pilgrimage if needed, and end of pilgrimage transportation back to Sanford. Pilgrims must provide their own personal items, bedding, and **TENTS**. \$450.00 per adult / \$400.00 per child (10-15 years)

Full Pilgrimage Walk Only – Includes the above (minus canoes): \$350 per adult / \$300 per child (10-15 yrs.) Day Walker (no camping) – Includes meals, water, and snacks: \$40.00 per day

Weekend Only (Friday dinner - Sunday lunch) - St. Augustine KOA Campground. Costs include meals, water, snacks, campground fees, transportation to campground while on route if needed, end of pilgrimage transportation back to Sanford. \$130 per person with cabin stay or \$100 per person with personal tent stay.

***Family reduced rates apply to four persons minimum. Email for family discounts or part time rates.

PASCUA FLORIDA PILGRIMAGETM 2025 TERMS AND CONDITIONS

PILGRIMAGE PARTICIPANTS: This pilgrimage is designed for faithful of the Society of St. Pius X. St. Thomas More Priory reserves the right to accept or reject any person as a pilgrimage participant and to expel from the pilgrimage any participant whose conduct is deemed incompatible with the group's interests. Modesty in dress is required. Minors under 18 must be accompanied by a parent. Children under 10 may only participate in the walking sections and must be accompanied by a parent. If children must leave the pilgrimage and be taken to camp early, a parent must accompany.

RESERVATION AND PAYMENT: 50% deposit and completed registration is required by March 21, 2025 to hold space on this pilgrimage. The balance of the full payment is due by April 4, 2025. The late fee is \$75. Space for this pilgrimage is limited.

CANCELLATION PENALTIES: All cancellations requested by participants must be in writing. If cancellation is received after March 21, 2025, the deposit will be retained.

PILGRIMAGE CANCELLATION: If the pilgrimage is cancelled before April 4, 2025 for lack of participants, it will refund all monies paid for the scheduled pilgrimage. In the event of extreme weather preventing both canoeing and walking, the pilgrimage may be canceled early and partial refund will be given.

PILGRIMAGE SCHEDULE: The itineraries depend mainly on weather conditions. If these conditions cause cancellation of canoe trips, alternate walks will be substituted.

AIRPORT ARRIVALS AND DEPARTURES: Pilgrimage volunteers try to provide airport transportation; however, transportation dates and times are limited. To arrange airport transportation, contact pilgrimage@stmpa.net *prior* to purchasing your flights.

CAMPING AND CABIN INFORMATION EACH PERSON MUST PROVIDE HIS/HER OWN TENT AND SLEEPING/BEDDING GEAR. Each person must be able to set up the tent and bedding alone or with the help of a companion. Friday and Saturday nights all participants will stay in camping cabins to the maximum extent, or in their personal tents if they choose. Cabins are for three or five persons. Organizers will assign cabins and try to accommodate families or groups as roommates.

PHYSICAL HEALTH: Participants will take full responsibility for being fully able to participate in the daily scheduled activities of the pilgrimage. This pilgrimage <u>REQUIRES PILGRIMS BE ABLE TO WALK UP TO 23 MILES ON SOME DAYS AND A COMBINATION OF CANOE AND WALK ON OTHER DAYS AS LISTED. THIS ITINERARY IS FOR 6 CONSECUTIVE DAYS.</u> One may choose not to participate in parts of the pilgrimage; however, there is no refund for missed parts. There is limited ability to transport pilgrims from one camping site to the next.

CANOE RESTRICTIONS: In order to be allowed to canoe pilgrims:

- Must be able to follow verbal and/or visual instructions.
- Must be 10 years or older and accompanied by parent if under 18 years.
- Must not exceed the manufacturer's limit for the vessel which is the combined weight of all participants in the boating party with gear: Canoes 780 lb.; Kayak Solo 195 lb.; Kayak Tandem 475 lb.
- Must be able to swim and wear a properly fitted personal flotation device (PFD).
- Must be able to enter and exit the canoe/kayak independently or with the assistance of a companion.
- Must be able to remain seated, maneuver, and balance independently or with the assistance of a companion in a canoe or a double kayak and move the canoe/kayak through the water in a stable manner.
- Must be able to get out from under the watercraft independently and be able to right oneself and remain face up in the water with the aid of a PFD in the event of a capsize.

Participation in boating activities may be dangerous. St. Thomas More Priory reserves the right to deny persons participation in this event if they are unable to follow the rules. Boating supervisor will assign each person to a vessel. Maximum capacity - Canoes for two to three persons, kayaks one or two depending on individual vessels. All occupants must wear their PFD. Provided whistles must be aboard canoes & kayaks.

OTHER WATER CAUTIONS: Carry drinking water and bug spray. State law prohibits the feeding of alligators. Intentional capsizing or swamping is prohibited. Do not stay on the water in the event of thunder or lightning. If your vessel capsizes or swamps, it will continue to float. **Hold on to the vessel** as you make your way to shore.

PRIMITIVE/ROAD/BIKE PATH WALKS: Primitive walk areas and paved paths have limited access to bathrooms. Be sure every morning to review the scheduled bathroom breaks. Please advise your group leader if you need assistance or transportation to the next camp site. Walking may be uneven up or down slopes, on primitive nature trails, and, at times, on sidewalks and terrain. Pilgrims will walk on side/shoulder of road against the flow of traffic on the left side of the road. A pedestrian shall obey applicable traffic laws where sidewalks are provided, and to the extent possible pilgrims will use these and will not walk in the street where sidewalks are not provided.

REQUIRED SUPPLIES: wide brim sun hat, sunscreen, proper footwear, items needed for personal health and safety, ponchos, flashlight, personal TENT and bedding. Every pilgrim is required to carry a first aid kit while on route. The first aid kit must include preventative blister tape, preventative products for blisters, sunburn, and minor injuries, as well as bandages and care/healing products for blisters, sunburn, and minor injuries.

REQUIRED INJURY PREVENTION and CARE Every pilgrim is required bring the supplies necessary for prevention and treatment of his/her own blisters, sunburns, and minor injuries. Every pilgrim is required to have the knowledge and the ability to prevent and to treat his/her own blisters, sunburns, and minor injuries and must perform this self-care. Every pilgrim is required to drink adequate water to stay well hydrated.

SUGGESTED SUPPLIES AND PRECAUTIONS: insect repellent, sunglasses, two layers of socks, such as high percentage wool thin socks. These socks tend to rub against each other instead of the skin, thus reducing the cause of blisters. Avoid cotton socks that abrade feet when damp. Prevent blisters by taping feet before walking. If feeling a hot spot or a blister coming on, treat it immediately and tape the area. Research online for blister prevention and foot care for long hikes, including lancing and draining of blisters. Experienced pilgrims highly recommend high percentage merino wool socks, Leukotape®P for foot tape, and Ecco®, Clarks®, or Keen® sandals. These are suggestions. Please research online to find the best products and care methods for yourself.

ADDITIONAL CAUTION: Central Florida is known as the lightning capital of the world. If you are caught out in the open during a storm, attempt to reach cover as quickly as possible.

ANIMALS: Do not interact with or feed the wildlife. Do not pick or disturb plants. These laws are for your safety and the safety of Florida's plants and wildlife. Store food in locked containers and dispose of trash properly.

BAGGAGE/GEAR: A vehicle will transport overnight baggage to the next site. All baggage must be waterproof and be labelled with pilgrim's name. Each morning, pack overnight belongings and check that identification tags are attached. Place baggage in your assigned transport vehicle.

RESPONSIBILITY & LIABILITY: Participant agrees to sign additional waivers that may be required. St. Thomas More Priory acts only as an agent for the various independent suppliers that provide campsites, cabins, transportation, activities, or other services connected with this pilgrimage. Such services are subject to the terms and conditions of those suppliers. St. Thomas More Priory and their respective employees, agents, representatives, and assignees accept no liability whatsoever for any injury, damage, loss, accident, delay, or any other incident which may be caused by the negligence, defect, or default of any company or person in performing these services. Responsibility is not accepted for ANY losses, injury, damages or expenses of any kind, INCLUDING THOSE due to sickness, mental disorders, weather, strikes, hostilities, wars, terrorist acts, acts of nature, local laws, or other such cause.
